

## Scripps to report second-quarter results; webcast of conference call available

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**CINCINNATI** – The E.W. Scripps Co. (NYSE: SSP) will report second-quarter operating results before New York Stock Exchange trading begins on Friday, Aug. 8. A telephone conference call with members of the company's senior management team will follow at 9 a.m. Eastern time.

The media and general public are granted access to the conference call on a listen-only basis.
