
interview spot

In the long hallway near the Media Desk (see map on page 9), there will be a step-and-repeat that provides a Bee-branded background for video interviews.

championship moment

After the competitor correctly spells the winning word, Adam Symson, president and CEO of The E.W. Scripps Company, will present the Scripps Cup to the champion. Once ION signs off from its broadcast coverage, we will set up a press conference onstage.

All credentialed media can come on stage to get the champion's comments.





The Bee on Scripps Networks (All times Eastern)

The 2025 broadcast/livestream of onstage competition follows this schedule (all times Eastern and end times approximate):

- The **preliminaries** will be streamed on Bounce XL, Grit Xtra, Laff More and spellingbee.com from 8 a.m. to 4:40 p.m. on Tuesday, May 27.
- The **quarterfinals** will be streamed on Bounce XL, Grit Xtra, Laff More and spellingbee.com from 8 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. on Wednesday, May 28.
- The **semifinals** broadcast will air 8-10 p.m. on ION on Wednesday, May 28. (The live semifinals will be streamed on Bounce XL, Grit Xtra, Laff More and spellingbee.comfrom 2:30 to 6:30 p.m. earlier that day.)
- The **finals** will air live in primetime on ION from 8-10 p.m. on Thursday, May 29.

In addition to ION, the semifinals and finals will also air on Scripps' other popular national entertainment networks, Bounce, Grit, ION Mystery and Laff, as well as its free, ad-supported streaming channels ION Plus, Scripps News, Bounce XL, Grit Xtra Laff More and spellingbee.com. Scripps News will stream an encore of the semifinals on Thursday, May 29, from 1 a.m. to 3 a.m. and the finals on May 29 from 11 p.m. to 1 a.m. The Scripps Networks can be found free over-the-air as well as on cable, satellite and streaming platforms.

Note: Quarterfinalist, semifinalist, finalist and champion monetary awards are not cumulative; that is, a speller moving on to the semifinals will not receive both the quarterfinalist and semifinalist gift cards, but a quarterfinalist who does not qualify for the semifinals will receive everything listed at the quarterfinalist level.

* Spellers who are eliminated from the competition in the same round are assigned the same rank (place).


Spellers competing in the Spell-off (if activated) will be ranked according to number of words spelled correctly; any spellers who spell the same number of words correctly will be assigned the same rank (place) except in the case of a tie for first. In that case, the winner will be the speller who achieved the highest percentage correct out of words attempted during the Spell-off. If there is still a tie, co-champions will be declared. Misspellings during the Spell-off do not result in immediate elimination.

If two or more spellers tie for first place, the cash prize for each will be \$50,000. Cash prizes for spellers who are tied for 2nd through 6th place will be determined by the method used in the following example: If three spellers tied for 4th place, the cash prize for each would be the sum of the prize amounts for 4th, 5th and 6th place divided by three; therefore, each speller tied for 4th place would receive \$5,833.33 (\$2,500 + \$5,000 + \$10,000) /3).



storylines

Here's a look at some of the competitors in the 2025 Scripps National Spelling Bee.



There are 53 spellers returning from the 2024 field—and 178 spellers are competing in their first Scripps National Spelling Bee (73 percent).

THE VETERANS Tarini Nandakumar (speller 204) from Texas is competing in her fifth consecutive Bee. She was a finalist and finished ninth in 2023. Navtaj Singh (speller 62) from Idaho, Micah Sterling (speller 152) from New York and Avinav Prem Anand (speller 167) from Ohio are competing in their fourth straight national competition. Harini Murali (speller 136) from New Jersey is in her fourth Bee overall (2021, 2022, 2024), as is Faizan Zaki from Texas (2019, 2023, 2024).

U.S. COVERAGE There are spellers from all 50 states. Texas has the largest representation with 22 national competitors, two more than last year. California is next with 20, followed by Ohio (15) and Illinois (13). Florida and New York have 12 each.

RETURNING FINALIST

Only one 2024 finalist advanced to the 2025 national competition: That's **Faizan Zaki** (speller 207), who you may recall finished second last year behind Bruhat Soma following his record-breaking Spell-off. This is Zaki's fourth Scripps National Spelling Bee appearance. He has one remaining year of eligibility after 2025.



THE YOUNGEST -> Zachary Teoh (speller 213), a second grader from Texas, is the youngest speller this year at age 8. Aadhya Adhikari (speller 173) from Ohio is the only 9 year old.

There are 72 spellers who are 14 years old. That's roughly 30 percent of the field. The oldest are Andrew Ford (speller 60) from Idaho and Eli Neibart (speller 137) from New Jersey, both of whom turn 15 on Aug. 17. Amanuel Gemechis (speller 197) from South Dakota turns 15 a day later.

LONG DISTANCE → Alleena Villaluz (speller 57) from Saipan, a U.S. commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands roughly 133 miles (by air) from Guam, is traveling the farthest for this week's competition (almost 7,800 miles). This is her second consecutive Bee. Other spellers are coming from Canada, the Bahamas, Germany, Ghana, Kuwait, Nigeria, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. There are 13 competitors from outside the 50 United States.

THE TWING → Faizan Zaki, the only returning finalist, has a twin, Zara Jabeen. Connor Norton (speller 193) from South Carolina has a twin sister, Cassady. Josephine Frimpong (speller 84) from Kentucky has a twin sister, Judith. Alejandro Martinez (speller 214) from Texas is a triplet with brother Abraham and sister Abigail.

Josslyn Hansen (speller 121) from Minnesota has eight siblings: four brothers (Asher 16, Sam 15, Hunter 14, Calvin 6) and four sisters (Sophia 15, Ivy 12, Brynlee 11, Mia 3) in a blended family.

NOTABLE LEGACIES

Zwe Spacetime (speller 39) from Washington, D.C., is the younger brother of 2021 champion Zaila Avant-garde. He is 13 and making his first appearance in the national competition. Ved Raju (speller 35) from Colorado is the younger brother of Vikram Raju, the 2022 runner-up. William Fuller (speller 179) from Oklahoma is the younger brother of Edith Fuller, who in 2017 became the youngest-ever competitor in the Scripps National Spelling Bee at 6 years, 1 month old. William is 12, one of seven siblings, and making his first Bee appearance. For more on Edith, see page 30.

in the beginning ...

The first National Spelling Bee was June 17, 1925. It was sponsored by the Louisville Courier-Journal, which invited other newspapers around the country to hold spelling bees and send their champions to Washington, D.C. There were nine participants that first year who competed at the National Museum auditorium in Washington, D.C. Frank Neuhauser, 11, from Louisville was the winner. The Courier-Journal sponsored the Bee until 1941 when Scripps-Howard Newspapers – now The E.W. Scripps Company – took it over.







museum exhibit

"More than Words: A Journey through the first 100 years of the Scripps National Spelling Bee" is a museum-quality exhibit that showcases the Bee's wealth of historical memorabilia, highlights key milestones in the competition's history, examines the Bee's place in popular culture and the American experience, and demonstrates the impact of the Bee on children and communities. The exhibit also tells the story of The E.W. Scripps Company's dedication to the program, including reviving the Bee after World War II and the COVID pandemic. The exhibit, underwritten by a grant from the Adam R. Scripps Foundation, will be located in Camellia 4 for the duration of Bee Week.

international spellers

There's a long history of international participation in the Scripps National Spelling Bee. Of note:

- First known speller from outside the U.S.: Fred Souk, the Azores, represented Stars and Stripes of Europe, 1957. Note: He was an American who previously lived in North Carolina.
- First non-U.S. citizen: 1959 South Texas Bee champ Gerardo Aguirre who was from Nuevo Laredo in Mexico, right across the border from Laredo, Texas.
- First speller from South America: John Fawcett, Sao Paulo, Brazil 1976, an American living in Sao Paulo, Brazil, whose father was a missionary. The Brazil Herald of Rio de Janeiro-Sao Paolo was the sponsor.
- This year, spellers from Nigeria and Kuwait earned spots in the Bee. It is the first time for those countries.

Over the years, there have been spellers from American Samoa, the Azores, the Bahamas, Brazil, Canada, China, Germany, Ghana, Guam, Jamaica, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, Puerto Rico, Saudi Arabia, South Korea and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

"The Scripps National Spelling Bee will continue to evolve and always be looking ahead," Executive Director Corrie Loeffler says. "What won't ever change is our emphasis on providing the best possible experience for spellers when they come to Bee Week. We want it to be a transformative moment in their lives, and allowing spellers from other countries and other cultures adds to that."

sibling magic

Sriram Hathwar (2014) and **Jairam Hathwar** (2016) from Corning, New York, are the only brothers to have won the Scripps National Spelling Bee.

The only sisters to have won are **Kavya Shivashankar** (2009) and **Vanya Shivashankar** (2015) from Olathe, Kansas. Kavya is a member of the Word Panel and a judge at the Bee. Vanya has been serving as a Bee Week emcee and this year will become the first female pronouncer at the national level.





how the spelling bee process works

the basics

- Students must not have passed beyond the eighth grade.
- Students can't be older than 15.
- Champions are not eligible to compete again.

timeline

- September-December: Classroom and school spelling bees are held.
- Jan. 31: Deadline for schools to enroll (roughly 23,000 schools enrolled in 2024-25). School fees were \$199 for 2024-25.
- September-January: School spelling bees are held; students qualify for regional spelling bees. The majority take place in January.
- Feb. 1 March 31: Regional spelling bees are held, and national competitors are determined. Most regional bees advance only one winner, while some do advance other top finishers.

regional partners

Each regional spelling bee has a regional partner which oversees the competition and sponsors students to advance to the national competition. Regional partners can be community organizations, businesses, media outlets, sports teams or other kinds of companies.

Regional partners manage their spelling bees, and all decisions by local officials are final. The Scripps National Spelling Bee provides a framework and materials for the competitions and may act in an advisory role but does not have decision-making authority over regional spelling bees.

details, details ...

spelling rounds

- Time: Spellers have 90 seconds to correctly spell a word once it has been pronounced; spellers cannot ask questions during the final 15 seconds of their turn.
- Questions: Spellers are permitted to ask the pronouncer:
 - Definition
 - Part of speech
 - Use the word in a sentence
 - Language(s) of origin
 - Alternate pronunciations
 - Repeat the word

vocabulary rounds

- **Origin**: Introduced as an onstage competition element in 2021. (Vocabulary questions have been a consistent part of the competition since 2012, when they were first introduced as part of a written test that was the first round of the competition until 2019.)
- **Intent**: Vocabulary rounds were introduced as an onstage element to challenge a speller's understanding of the words, putting less emphasis on the rote memorization of spelling.
- **Rules**: Spellers are given 30 seconds to answer a multiple-choice question about the definition of a word.

Potential for the competition to end in a Spell-off

round 3 written test

Spellers who advance from rounds 1 and 2 of the preliminaries on Tuesday will advance to take the round 3 written test on Tuesday evening. The test will include both spelling and vocabulary questions. Scores from the round 3 written test will determine the spellers who will advance to round 4 (quarterfinals) on Wednesday morning. Spellers will be notified of their scores Tuesday evening. The source for the round 3 written test is Merriam-Webster Unabridged.

how the spell-off works

- Origin: Introduced in 2021
- How it works: Officials have the option to activate a Spell-off to conclude the Finals.
- Rules: Each speller has 90 seconds to spell as many words as possible while the other speller is sequestered with headphones on, unable to hear the words being read. Each speller gets the same words read in the same order. If there is a tie, the winner is determined by who spells a higher percentage of words attempted correctly. The spellers may not pass and are encouraged to try to spell each word given.
- History:
 - 2024: Champion Bruhat Soma spelled 29 words correctly. Runner-up Faizan Zaki spelled 20 words correctly.
 - 2023: Was not used.
 - 2022: Champion Harini Logan spelled 22 words correctly. Runner-up Vikram Raju spelled 15 words correctly. (Note: Judges originally credited Logan with 21 words but added one more after reviewing video of the Spell-off.)
 - 2021: Was not used.



review process

Taken from official rules of the Scripps National Spelling Bee: Rule 10: Internal Review and Appeals

Throughout the competition, officials manage a real-time review process consisting of live and recorded cross-checking of spellers' interactions with officials and of the word list. One official serves exclusively as the spellers' advocate by reviewing audio and video files, escalating any issues through officials, and, where necessary, acting on officials' requests for further review. If a speller, a speller's parent or quardian, or the regional partner of a speller wishes to raise an issue to the attention of officials, they may do so according to the following Appeal Process and

Timeliness Requirement:

- A written appeal form must be requested from, completed and submitted to the Bee Week Help Desk.
- The deadline to submit an appeal is before the speller would have received their next word had they stayed in the spelling bee. Effort should be made to submit an appeal by the end of the round in which the speller was eliminated.
- · When five or fewer spellers remain in the competition, an oral appeal must be made at the Bee Week Help Desk before the speller would have received their next word had they stayed in the spelling bee.
- Only a speller, a speller's parent or quardian, or a speller's regional partner may request, complete, or submit an appeal form or lodge an oral appeal.
- Individuals who have filed appeals or who wish to file an appeal, or representatives of those individuals, may not directly approach officials.

A speller who received a correct pronunciation and definition for a spelling word has no grounds for appeal.

Communicating results:

- If the judges rule to alter a prior determination, whether as the result of an appeal or of internal review, the affected speller and/or the speller's representative will be notified.
- If there is no change to a contested decision, officials are under no obligation to publicly communicate the decision or discuss the details of the ruling. The appellant or their representative may approach the Bee Week Help Desk for information on the status of their appeal.

All decisions of Scripps National Spelling Bee officials are final.





associate pronouncer:

The associate pronouncer answers the speller's questions about root words and is on-call to serve as pronouncer should the need arise and serves as quality assurance for the pronouncer during the competition. The associate pronouncer has expertise in etymology and in pronouncing words according to diacritical markings.

Bee Week:

Starts when spellers arrive at the location for the national competition.

finalist:

Speller who advances to the final rounds of the national competition.

head judge:

The head judge serves as the administrator of the competition rules during the competition and delivers rulings on spellings and answers provided by spellers. The head judge maintains a thorough knowledge of the competition rules and confidently rules on questions regarding the competition with input from fellow judges.

judges:

Judges maintain focus during the competition and rule on spellings and answers provided by spellers. Judges maintain a thorough knowledge of the competition rules and confidently and swiftly weigh in on internal or external questions regarding the competition.

national competitor:

Speller who advances from regional competition to the Scripps National Spelling Bee, considered the national competition.

pronouncer:

The pronouncer pronounces the words and provides all requested word information to the speller during spelling rounds and reads vocabulary questions and answers during vocabulary rounds using prepared competition materials. The pronouncer has expertise in etymology and in pronouncing words according to diacritical markings.

regional partner:

Host of regional competition that pays for speller(s) to advance to national competition.

sponsor:

Pays for advertising/activation/name alignment with Scripps National Spelling Bee or portions of the broadcast.
